From the Pastor: *“If your church closed tomorrow, how much time would pass before the local community noticed?”* This question is often proposed to church leaders in order to generate a review of the church’s impact on that local community. It is my conclusion that people would notice very quickly if St. Willebrord Parish closed our doors.

First of all, a total of more than 100 people attend Daily Mass, and nearly 2000 every weekend. Nearly 500 students attend Faith Formation on a weekly basis.

Our outreach to the poor is daily, direct, and multi-faceted. We provide sandwiches and beverages to anyone who comes to our door, about 15-20 per day. Some of the homeless spend long periods of time warming and resting themselves in our buildings. Sometimes in the quiet of a mostly empty church you will hear the snoring of the men or women who have found some respite from their hardships. These same women and men are also very heavy users of our bathroom facilities as they “freshen up” for the day.

Our parish supports a food pantry which can be used up to once per month by families living within a designated region around the parish. In 2015 we distributed food to 444 households, including 672 adults and 642 children. The food is largely donated by parishioners. From donated funds we also serve a monthly meal at the N.E.W. Community Shelter which is now serving more than 200 meals a night. Finally, we offer our Parish Center as an overflow shelter to the nearby St. John the Evangelist Homeless Shelter from November through April. They needed to use it a couple of times this season. Each Christmas we provide food for needy families and gifts for children. Our parish typically helps about 50 families with 150 children.

In addition to the above, in the past 12 months we have given about \$20,000 to needy families for rent assistance, electricity and water bills, food, short hotel stays, and other miscellaneous needs. This money comes from a grant we receive from The Augustine Stewardship Fund of St. Norbert Abbey. The average amount of assistance was about \$260. Many of those we helped were parishioners. Some were families who simply had nowhere else to go.

Home Missions Appeal Next weekend, May 14 -15, 2016

Next weekend, **May 14 and 15**, the annual collection for **Home Missions- Our Own Needs** will take place. Please, generously support these collections through donation and prayer so that the Church can continue its important work here in the diocese and throughout the country. The four major beneficiaries represented in this collection are:

Catholic University of America – is the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, located in Washington, D.C. It provides an academically rigorous education guided by Catholic intellectual tradition to nearly 7,000 students every year. More than 4,000 students directly receive scholarship aid from this Collection, including many from our Diocese.

Catholic Communications Campaign – This Collection communicates the Good News through Catholic social media activities and enriches our faith through podcasts, television, radio, and print media. Half of all proceeds remain in our Diocese. CCC is how the Good News gets around **to you**.

Catholic Home Missions Appeal – primarily supports dioceses in the United States and its territories that are unable to offer their people the basic pastoral ministries of word, worship, and service without outside help. The Appeal supports evangelization activities religious education, ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, brothers, laypeople and support of poor parishes across the country.

In our Diocese, we annually receive a grant from this collection to assist parishes in Neopit & Keshena in their outreach and service to People of the First Nation (Menominee Indian Tribe).

Mensaje de Nuestro Párroco: “¿Si tu iglesia cerrara mañana, cuanto tiempo pasaría antes de que la comunidad local lo notara?” Esta pregunta se les plantea con frecuencia a los líderes de la iglesia para generar un análisis del impacto de la iglesia en la comunidad local. Es mi conclusión que si llegara a suceder que San Willebrord cerrara sus puertas las

personas lo notarían muy rápido.

Primero que nada, un total de más de 100 personas asisten a la Misa diaria, y casi 2000 cada fin de semana. Alrededor de 500 estudiantes asisten al programa de Formación en la Fe semanalmente.

Nuestra asistencia a los pobres es directa, de muchos aspectos, y de todos los días. Proveemos sándwiches y algo para tomar a quien sea que venga a nuestras puertas, entre 15 a 20 por día. Algunos indigentes pasan mucho tiempo en nuestros edificios tratando de protegerse del frío y descansando un poco. Algunas veces, en el silencio de la iglesia casi vacía, se escucha el ronquido de algún hombre o mujer que ha encontrado un descanso a sus problemas. Estos mismos hombres y mujeres usan mucho nuestros baños, para “refrescarse” en el día.

Nuestra parroquia tiene una despensa la cual puede ser usada una vez al mes por familias que viven dentro de los límites de nuestra parroquia. In el 2015 distribuimos comida a 444 hogares, incluyendo 672 adultos y 642 niños. La comida es donada principalmente por parroquianos. Usando fondos donados, también servimos una cena mensualmente en el Refugio NEW Community, el cual sirve más de 200 cenas por día. Finalmente, nosotros también tenemos nuestro Centro Comunitario a disposición del Refugio para Indigentes de San Juan Evangelista, de Noviembre a Abril. Ellos terminan usándolo quizás un par de veces por temporada. Cada Navidad proveemos comida para familias necesitadas y regalos para sus hijos. Nuestra parroquia ayuda típicamente a 50 familias con un total de 150 niños.

A demás de lo ya mencionado, en los pasados 12 meses hemos dado alrededor de \$20,000 a familias necesitadas para asistencia de renta, facturas de electricidad y agua, cortas estadías en hotel, y otras muchas necesidades. Este dinero proviene de una beca/subvención que recibimos del Fondo de Corresponsabilidad Agustina de la Abadía de San Norberto. La cantidad promedio de asistencia fue de \$260. Muchos de los que ayudamos fueron parroquianos. Otros eran familias que simplemente no tenían a donde ir.
