From the Pastor: Remembering the past – is it good or bad? In my experience memory is not just one or the other. Some memories have warm, consoling, and encouraging aspects.

Other memories lead to sadness, shock, and even bitterness. Some memories have both positive and harsh qualities.

As I write this article, I am also conscious that I *forget* many experiences. It seems strange *to remember that I forget*, but it is true. In fact, I do not know that I have forgotten something until someone reminds me. I need a stimulus, a reminder, or something that triggers that part of my brain where memories are stored. In a general way, I want to be aware that I have the capacity to both remember and forget.

Recently, I remembered that someone told me about a very important personal experience. Because the experience was so much more important to the other, then most important thing that I could do was to be listen as s/he was telling me about what happened. In that moment, I was very focused and alert to the person, to what was being said. I was trying to assess the needs and emotions of the person in order to respond appropriately. But, after the appointment, I tried NOT to remember. The person asked me not to do anything in relation to what s/he said, so I tried to let the memory go.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, I try NOT to remember anything more than the happiness and relief that the penitent demonstrates as s/he receives absolution of sin and then departs from the confessional. I concentrate on the hope that the person does not sin again. I am not dwelling on the sin, but on all of the reasons to hope in God and in that person. Then, the next penitent appears and it is time to focus on him/her. I need to focus on the next person who wants to receive and feel God's loving forgiveness. It is time to forget the past and pay attention to the present. Many penitents have heard me say: "Remembering our past sins and mistakes is not so that we can feel guilty. Rather, we remember the past in order to *learn*, even from our mistakes."

Over the years I have written several reflections about memory and the past. I do not think that I have ever written one like the above, but it is possible that I have forgotten. :)

Feast of St. Blaise


Saturday, February 3 is the feast of St. Blaise. So the weekend of February 1 and 2, 2020 we will have blessings of throats before and after all weekend Masses.

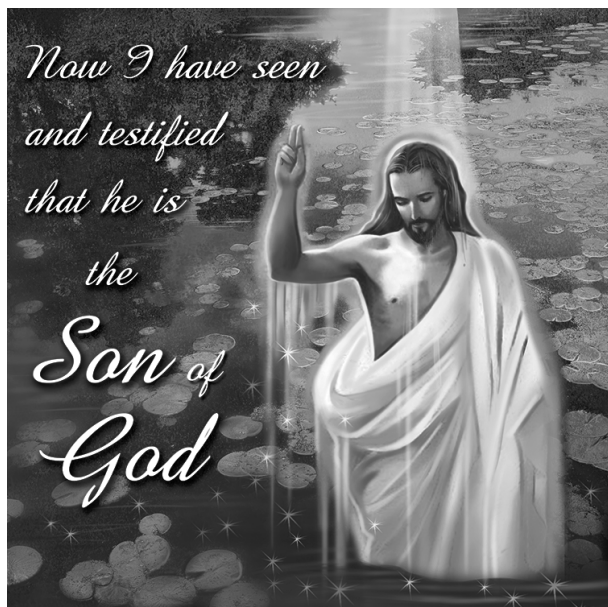

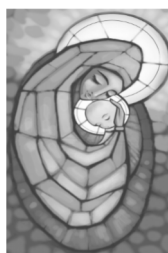

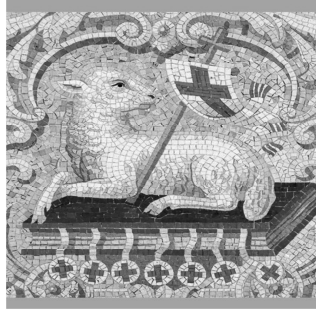

January 19, 2020

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's first reading reveals the Lord's super-sized heart. "It is too little," according to God, to protect and guide only the tribes of Jacob. The enormity of God's love cannot limit itself to one nation; divine love overflows, spilling liberally over all people everywhere. Isaiah, prophet of the long-suffering Israelites, might have been surprised to hear that the salvation of his people is not enough for God. But God always wants more than what we want. God's passion outstrips all of our deepest desires. We are merely creatures. Compared to the hugeness of our Creator's designs, we will always want too little, have too little, know too little, love too little. This littleness frustrates us throughout life. But exactly when we admit our littleness, we make room for Christ.



NEVER TOO LATE

John the Baptist models for us the grace of littleness. Twice in today's Gospel reading, John admits, "I did not know." Even though John has ordered his entire life toward the goal of preparing the world for the Messiah, he does not, on his own, recognize Christ when he sees him. The Gospel insists John "did not know" Jesus; in his humility, John relies entirely on God for direction. John waits and waits—baptizing, praying, preaching—until, finally, the Holy Spirit reveals the Messiah.

John had waited his whole life for this confirmation from the Spirit. God's chosen people, the Israelites, had waited much, much longer. Surely many wondered if God would ever send the Messiah as promised. But God is never late. In our littleness, we cannot see the arc of all human history with God's clarity and love. Each of us aches deeply for some good thing: a cure, a resolution, a rest, a fair break. When we are made to wait for what seems obviously beneficial, we sometimes wonder if God is really as all-powerful and all-loving as people say. Today's readings invite us to trust.

Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La primera lectura de hoy muestra el corazón súper grande del Señor. "Es demasiado poco", de acuerdo a Dios, proteger y guiar sólo a las tribus de Jacob. La magnitud del amor de Dios no puede limitarse a sí mismo para una nación; el amor divino se desborda, derramándose generosamente en todas las personas en todas partes. Isaías, el profeta sufriente de los israelitas, podría haberse sorprendido de escuchar que la salvación de su pueblo no era suficiente para Dios. Pero Dios siempre quiere más de lo que nosotros queremos. La pasión de Dios supera todos nuestros deseos más profundos. Somos simplemente creaturas. Comparado con la inmensidad de los diseños de nuestro Creador, siempre queremos demasiado poco, tenemos demasiado poco, sabemos demasiado poco, amamos demasiado poco. Esta escasez nos frustra a lo largo de la vida. Pero exactamente cuando admitimos nuestra escasez, hacemos espacio para Cristo.

NUNCA ES TARDE

Juan el Bautista modela para nosotros la gracia de la pequeñez. En el Evangelio de hoy, dos veces Juan admite "no lo conozco". Aunque Juan había ordenado toda su vida hacia la meta de preparar el mundo para el Mesías, él no, por su cuenta, reconoce a Cristo cuando lo ve. El Evangelio insiste Juan, "no conoce" a Jesús; con humildad, Juan confía plenamente en Dios por consejo. Juan espera y espera bautizando, orando, predicando, hasta que finalmente, el Espíritu Santo le revela al Mesías.

Juan había esperado toda su vida por esta confirmación del Espíritu. El pueblo elegido de Dios, los israelitas habían esperado demasiado, mucho más. Seguramente muchos se preguntaban si Dios llegaría a enviar al Mesías como lo había prometido. Pero a Dios nunca se le hace tarde. En nuestra pequeñez, no podemos ver el arco de la historia humana con la claridad y amor de Dios. Cada uno de nosotros ansia profundamente por algunas cosas buenas: una sanación, una decisión, un apoyo, un justo descanso. Cuando se nos hace esperar por lo que parece un beneficio obvio, algunas veces preguntamos si Dios es en realidad todopoderoso y lleno de amor, así como la gente dice. Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a confiar.

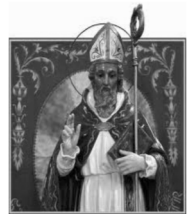

Mensaje de nuestro Pastor:

Recordando el pasado, ¿es bueno o malo? En mi experiencia, la memoria no es solo una u otra. Algunos recuerdos tienen aspectos cálidos, consoladores y alentadores. Otros recuerdos provocan tristeza, conmoción e incluso amargura. Algunos recuerdos tienen cualidades positivas y duras.

Mientras escribo este artículo, también soy consciente de que olvido muchas experiencias. Parece extraño recordar que lo olvido, pero es cierto. De hecho, no sé si he olvidado algo hasta que alguien me lo recuerda. Necesito algo que me estimule, un recordatorio o algo que habrá esa parte de mi cerebro donde se almacenan los recuerdos. De manera general, quiero ser consciente de que tengo la capacidad de recordar y olvidar.

Recientemente, recordé que alguien me contó sobre una experiencia personal muy importante. Como la experiencia era mucho más importante para el otro, lo más importante que podía hacer era escuchar mientras me contaba lo que sucedió. En ese momento, estaba muy concentrado y alerta a la persona, a lo que se decía. Estaba tratando de evaluar las necesidades y emociones de la persona para responder adecuadamente. Pero, después de la cita, intenté NO recordar. La persona me pidió que no hiciera nada en relación con lo que dijo, así que traté de dejar ir esa memoria y olvidar.

En el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, trato de NO recordar nada aparte de la felicidad y alivio que el penitente demuestra cuando recibe la absolución del pecado y luego se aleja del confesionario. Me concentro en la esperanza de que la persona no vuelva a pecar. No estoy pensando en el pecado, sino en todas las razones para tener esperanza en Dios y en esa persona. Luego, aparece el próximo penitente y es hora de concentrarse en él/ella. Necesito concentrarme en la próxima persona que quiere recibir y sentir del Perdón amoroso de Dios. Es hora de olvidar el pasado y prestar atención al presente. Muchos penitentes me han escuchado decir: "Recordar nuestros pecados y errores pasados no es para que podamos sentirnos culpables. Más bien, recordamos el pasado para aprender de todo, incluyendo nuestros errores".

Atreves de los años he escrito varias reflexiones sobre las memorias y el pasado. No creo haber escrito nunca uno como el anterior, pero es posible que lo haya olvidado. :)

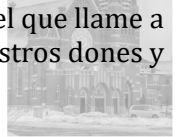
